Police Report: PC Fiona Hartley reported on the incident and crime figures for December 2018. The full report is available on the CC webpage. The focus for the month was speeding complaints and traffic issues at our schools during drop off and pick up times. Members requested speed camera surveillance at the entrance to Kincaidston and in Belmont Avenue.

Treasurers Report: Current Balance is £399.90.

Secretary Report: Relevant e mails were presented for discussion, namely Ayrshire Roads Alliance event, our support for the underpass at Dunure Road, SAC budget engagement, Dodds buses poor parking at Kincaidston Primary.
