## Notes

1. This report provides comparison crime figures for the month of September in 2016 and 2017.
2. The levels of reported crimes remains low and is positive overall. Breaches of the peace and Assaults have increased slightly but the detection rate remains high with regard to these crime types.
3. There were no reported Housebreakings or vehicle crime in the Ayr East ward which remained the same as last year but both offences are increasing slightly in other ward areas and is an on-going issue across Ayrshire, residents should remain vigilant regarding leaving items visible in their cars and ensuring their homes and cars are locked and secured correctly. The detection rates for these crimes remain quite low and anyone seen acting suspiciously should be reported to police immediately.
4. No drink driving offences were found in your ward area but our officers will continue high visibility patrols to deter road traffic crimes.
5. A multi-agency action plan is currently underway in respect of bogus workmen and additional patrols by trading standards, community safety officers and road policing units are concentrating their efforts in your area. Any suspicious activity at elderly or vulnerable neighbours' homes should be reported to us.
